standalone book in
Nassim Nicholas Taleb's
landmark Incerto series,
an investigation of
opacity, luck, uncertainty,
probability, human error,
risk, and decision-making

in a world we don't understand. The other books in the series are *Foiled by Randomness*, *The Black Swan*, *Antifragile*, and *Skin in the Game*. By the author of the modern classic *The Black Swan*, this collection of aphorisms and meditations expresses his major ideas in ways you least expect. *The Bed of Procrustes* takes its title from Greek mythology: the story of a man who made his visitors fit his bed to perfection by either stretching them or cutting their limbs. It

È tra le aree più ricche del mondo in termini di potenziale di risorse minerarie. E, per quanto concerne le riserve di litio, già è al centro di un caso internazionale che coinvolge Europa e Cina,

vicenda che precede di pochi mesi la guerra in Ucraina. Ma a Putin non basta, vuole colpire ancora l'UE: lo fa, soprattutto, con la guerra del gas; e scaricando sull'Europa la più grande emergenza umanitaria dalla Seconda guerra mondiale ai nostri giorni. La guerra di Putin sta marcando la fine della globalizzazione e l'inizio del mondo nuovo. È quello del decoupling, ovvero del disaccoppiamento delle catene del valore: quella occidentale e quella asiatica. È anche il mondo

in cui democrazie liberali e autocrazie hanno iniziato a contrapporsi.

Embarking on a unique study of Roman criminal law, Judy Gaughan has developed a novel

understanding of the nature of social and political power dynamics in republican government. Revealing the significant relationship between political power and attitudes toward homicide in the Roman republic, *Murder Was Not a Crime* describes a legal system through which families (rather than the government) were given the power to mete out punishment for murder. With implications that could modify the most fundamental beliefs about the Roman republic,

Gaughan's research maintains that Roman criminal law did not contain a specific enactment against murder, although it had done so prior to the overthrow of the monarchy. While kings felt an imperative to hold monopoly over the power to kill, Gaughan argues, the republic phase ushered in a form of decentralized government that did not see itself as vulnerable to challenge by an act of murder. And the power possessed by individual families

ensured that the government would not attain the responsibility for punishing homicidal violence. Drawing on surviving Roman laws and literary sources, *Murder Was Not a Crime* also explores the dictator Sulla's "murder law," arguing that it lacked any government concept of murder and was instead simply a collection of earlier statutes repressing poisoning, arson, and the carrying of weapons. Reinterpreting a spectrum of scenarios, Gaughan makes new distinctions

between the paternal head of household and his power over life and death, versus the power of consuls and praetors to command and kill.
