Big old grasshopper body, like a stilt-walking circus guy." *Speak* by Laurie Halse Anderson Figurative language refers to a language that deviates from the conventional work order and meaning in order to convey a complicated meaning, colorful writing, clarity, or evocative comparison. It uses an ordinary sentence to refer to something without directly stating it. Figurative language brings the reader deeper into the theme of the work, without the author having to explicitly lay out the theme for the reader. It is a way for the reader to enter the words with their minds and emotions, rather than simply comprehending a story or poem.
