Swales Six Characteristics of a discourse community. A discourse community has a broadly agreed set of common public goals. These public goals may be formally inscribed in documents (as is often the case with associations and clubs), or they may be more tacit (Swales 471)

The first characteristic of a Discourse community are common public goals.
